STUDENT PERFORMANCES/EXHIBITS/COMPETITION

The Board of Education recognizes that worthy and appropriate educational values accrue from student participation in civic and community affairs. Instructors may encourage students to contribute to public performances when their contribution will support their educational process and objectives and when their contribution does not interfere unduly with other scheduled classes or activities within the school.

Assemblies, public programs and public performances by students shall be consistent with the educational goals of the schools. Therefore:

- 1. Programs should have both educational and inspirational value. Comedy and humor have a place, too.
- 2. Programs should have interest variety.
- 3. Wide participation in the programs should be encouraged.
- 4. Good taste should be demonstrated in the kinds of programs and behavior shown.
