

## CAREER/TRANSITION-TO-WORK EDUCATION

Therefore career education can provide order to what students presently perceive as a random collection of educational experiences by inter-relating skills with home, community and work environments and what they should perceive as a purpose to their education as they prepare for future adult roles. Career education can show the practical application of academic studies and in the process reinforce traditional learning methods.

In addition to assimilation of basic educational skills, the goals of career education shall have a vigorous guidance component and educational rationale in order to expose the student to the adult world.
