

STUDENT CONDUCT, DISCIPLINE, AND ATTENDANCE CODE

Colorado Springs School District 11 (the District) policies and procedures concerning conduct, discipline, and attendance shall be known as the "Student Conduct, Discipline, and Attendance Code" (the "Code"). The Code is designed to meet the following objectives:

- 1) To foster sound educational practice and productive learning and equip every student in the District for success today and in the future;
- 2) To develop in every student in the District a positive attitude toward self-discipline, regular attendance, and socially acceptable behavior;
- 3) To help every school in the District maintain a learning atmosphere which is safe, conducive to learning, and free from unnecessary disruption;
- 4) To ensure that every student in the District shows respect for authority, follows district rules and policies, and follows state and federal laws regarding conduct, discipline, and attendance in school.
- 5) To serve as a guide for District employees and community members regarding reasonable and appropriate interventions and consequences for unacceptable behavior and attendance.

The Superintendent (or his/her designee) is responsible for compiling and maintaining the list of District policies and procedures that make up the Conduct, Discipline, and Attendance Code. The listing of these policies and procedures shall be available on the District website at <http://www.d11.org/boe/policies/dctoc.htm>. The listing, with hyperlinks to the official electronic versions of the associated policies and procedures, shall be made available electronically to each student in elementary, middle, and high school and to every new student in the District. A hard copy of the Code listing and/or any individual document of the Code shall be provided by the school to any parent/legal guardian upon request. Parents/guardians, students, and staff shall be notified in a timely manner of any significant changes to policies or procedures that compromise the Code via school newsletters or other appropriate means.
